Hendricks Co. Program of Excellence "Growing Hope": Master Gardeners wrote a grant request for 4,372.29 to Hendricks County Solid Waste for the raised garden beds for Sycamore Services. This effort provides raised bed gardening for the 70 clients of Sycamore Services. Through the "Growing Hope" project these residents will learn more about growing plants and to more effectively extend that experience into their daily lives through home gardening (vegetables, fruit and flowers), selling product at farmers' markets, exhibiting their products at the Hendricks County 4-H Fair, and composting. Rosie Lenihan wrote grant. The grant was awarded to HCMG.

Hendricks County Extension Master Gardeners, in partnership with Hendricks CountyExtension Purdue Educators and Sycamore Services developed a Program of Excellence called "Growing Hope". Interns Terry Meingasner and Lynn Cochran and Master Gardener, Rosie Lenihan, provided hands-on guidance and planting of seeds and plants at the Sycamore site in Danville. Jon Cain headed up the session; joined by Pat Cockrum, Sycamore Services Executive Director and staff along with 12 Sycamore clients. The group planted vegetable seeds and plants as well as a variety of flowers. This effort provides raised bed gardening for the 70 clients of Sycamore Services.
