January Meeting Via Zoom

Out of an abundance of caution due to the extreme cold, the January meeting occurred on Zoom. Thanks to Jeff Pell who coordinated Zoom and Kristyn Horning for sending out the info. Our apology for the few who did not see the change and came to the conference center. The winter milk jug seed sowing presentation by Steve Pearl was postponed until the February 20th meeting, as it is a workshop.

Highlights of the meeting:

- New Treasurer Martha Rardin presented the 2024 budget to the membership. The budgeted expense for grants was discussed and the proposed budget for the grant line item was amended to \$0.
 Should we need to expend funds for grant proposals, the necessary funds will be requested.
- 2. Steve Somermeyer gave an update on GFAA (see article for more information) He mentioned the antique tractors will be back thanks to Bruce Crum. The tractors were a hit with both kids & adults last year! Also, GFAA T-shirts can be ordered.
- 3. Jeff Pell reported there are 37 people taking the Master Gardener course. There will be some volunteer hours posted to help with class. MGs can sign up to help with one class to allow volunteer hours for others.
- 4. Jeff reminded members to complete the annual agreement. He also suggested looking on the Purdue MG site as there are a variety of resources for educational hours. Great learning opportunity during extreme winter weather!
- 5. Eloisa Garza provided an update on the Plainfield Correctional Facility Garden, which is looking promising for this year. The new warden is supportive of the





garden program. There is a meeting on January 23rd; 16 facility residents and 6 MGs are "on board" with the garden project. There will be presentations for learning about gardens and planning every other week. The garden is being moved and will be larger.

3.Layout – Steve Pearl & Dennis Nelson; As a reminder the layout this year decreases the children's activity area and seed packet booth sizes to free up more vendor space.

4.Speaker recruitment – Kathe Rae reported that intern Laura Graham, will speak on "Bird and Butterfly Gardening". Deb Pease will present on the irrigation system she used in the demo garden last

summer. Kathe and Carol Gillaspy are seeking possible speakers on houseplants, vegetable garden tips and succulents. Ideas generated at the meeting included a basic introduction to gardening; soil sampling (Jan volunteered to follow up on soil sampling!) Hoping to gear the content towards novice gardeners. John and Dee Dottenwhy's daughter, who is an urban arborist has also offered to speak at GFAA and also at a HCMG monthly meeting. 8. Children's booth – Karen Smith reported there will be a pioneer theme in keeping with the Bicentennial theme. The booth will be smaller, but will still have a lot of fun kids' activities.
